Carts seem to disappear all too often. Carts left in the parking lots have a tendency to get stolen and carts that get left out on fingers can end up in the water and sink on windy days. At E-Dock, carts are often left blocking the dumpsters which means the trash doesn't get picked up and over flows.

STOP leaving the carts wherever! Bring them back to the head of the dock where they belong! People pay a small fortune for gym memberships so taking a few extra steps to put the carts where they belong will save you money!

We need everyone's help in taking care of the carts!

- **Please Return All Carts to the Head of the Dock!** Don't leave them in the parking lots, or by the slips. No one enjoys having to search through the marina to find a cart!
- Please Don't Overload the Carts! (ie NO engine blocks, loads of anchor chain or batteries!).

If you want to keep a cart for your exclusive use, consider buying one of the nifty folding varieties available at marine chandleries & online. At this point we strongly encourage people to consider this option.



Dumpsters

Please do not contaminate the recycling bins with non-recyclables! "Wishful Recycling" tends to do more harm than good when we toss items that we wish would be recycled into the bins we risk contaminating the entire load that can then just end up in the landfill instead.

- Please place only recyclable items in the recycling dumpsters. All other trash goes in the other bins.
- Please close the dumpster lids when you are finished. Open lids allows trash to spread!
- Please Do Not block the dumpsters with dock carts or debris. Blocked dumpsters don't get picked up and end up overflowing.
- Please take all hazardous waste items such as chemicals, batteries or electronics to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility.
