Do we have your Current Documentation or Registration?

The Slip Agreement requires boat owners to submit current Documentation or Registration as well as current Insurance. Documentation is with the US Coast Guard and has been an annual renewal in the past, however in recent years they have been offering multi-year (up to 5 years) renewal. Registration is with California DMV and is valid for two years with renewal on odd years with most expiring this December. Please send us your updated Certificate of Number when renewing.

There is a monthly "convenience fee" of \$100 per month for members who are unable to provide a copy of current vessel Documentation or Registration in a timely fashion. In most cases, the actual documentation or registration fee will be substantially less. "Sort've an incentive kind of a deal, huh?" — Captain Ron


All Pets Must Be On Leash
